Visit with the Idaho Governor!

Each year, one Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, and Venture has an opportunity to meet with Idaho's Governor and Scouting representatives from the other Idaho Boy Scout Councils. The delegation will take a tour of the Capitol, meet with the Governor, and deliver a short presentation of our Council's past year's accomplishments.

The trip is paid for by a generous sponsor who believes in Scouting and wants Scouts to be exposed to State Government. The sponsor also wants Scouts to realize that they can make a difference in their community and state.

The contingency leaves in the afternoon and travels to Boise and spends a night in a hotel. The next day, they give their report to the Governor, have lunch, and then travel home. All meals and hotel costs are covered by the sponsor.

A parent is invited to attend with the selected recipient. This is required for the Cub Scout and optional for the older Scouts.

The deadline for turning in the application is the end of November, the year prior to the visit. The visit generally happens during the second week of February.

Selected recipients are expected to wear a complete Scout Uniform (including pants) when the report is being made.

This is an exciting opportunity to go to our capital as well as learn about our government and meet Idaho's Governor.
